### FISCAL YEAR FY23 Review Highlights

#### MASSHIREGBWB UPDATE – Mr. John Murray

- Mr. Murray indicated that the FY23 allocations are proceeding as expected.
  - Funding for Adult line item up 9.3% (up \$56.600).
  - The Dislocated Worker line item increased this year up 15%

- One-Stop line item [these dollars are restricted funds and is for the administration of the Career Center) –up 6%
- > RESEA early Intervention for UI claimants all expanded end of August 2022.
- Mr. Murray talked about some of the Career Center staff leaving during the year (6) and now hiring more staff, which include being the process of interviewing for the ARPA Upskilling Navigator
- RESEA early Intervention for UI claimants all expanded end of August 2022
- MASSHIREGBWB UPDATE Ms. Michele Ahern
  - Ms. Michele Ahern presented FY2023 budget to date for the MassHireGBWB. [see attachment distributed: Fiscal Year Report FY2022
    - FY22 FY23

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- ✓ Ms. Ahern indicated that the MassHireGBWB chart shows where we were last year and proposed this year and the difference from 2022 and % increase from 2022
  - Change this year for Summer Jobs and Year-Round grants were separate contracts [Cycle 1 and Cycle 2]. The YW Summer Jobs closed August 31, 2022.
  - The FY23 budget due September 30, 2022 almost complete.
