Mobile Occupational & Vocational Education



With a generous donation from Brockton Area Transit (BAT), MassHire GBWB will soon be able to offer local employers/organizations a clean, comfortable, mobile training site inside of a renovated 25-foot bus containing 9 workstations with computers and internet and room for an instructor. The bus is equipped with a wheelchair lift and is handicapped accessible. This mobile learning lab will provide a dedicated space in which groups of employees may receive training on a variety of job-related topics such as: ESOL, Microsoft Office, customer service, leadership, etc. Being mobile and self-contained, this training incubator can be parked conveniently on company property and enhances the ability for a company to easily provide training to strengthen the skills of its workers. It will also be utilized as an extension of the career center, making job seeker services more conveniently accessible to members of the community. Let's get to work and get on the *MOVE!*



The decommissioned Dial-A-BAT Bus is a 2009 Ford Starcraft E450SD. 25 feet, 8 cylinder, 4 doors, 6 wheels, wheelchair lift. Gross vehicle weight is approximately 14,500 pounds.

The old logos and graphics were removed, and we're left with a clean, white exterior. A blank slate!



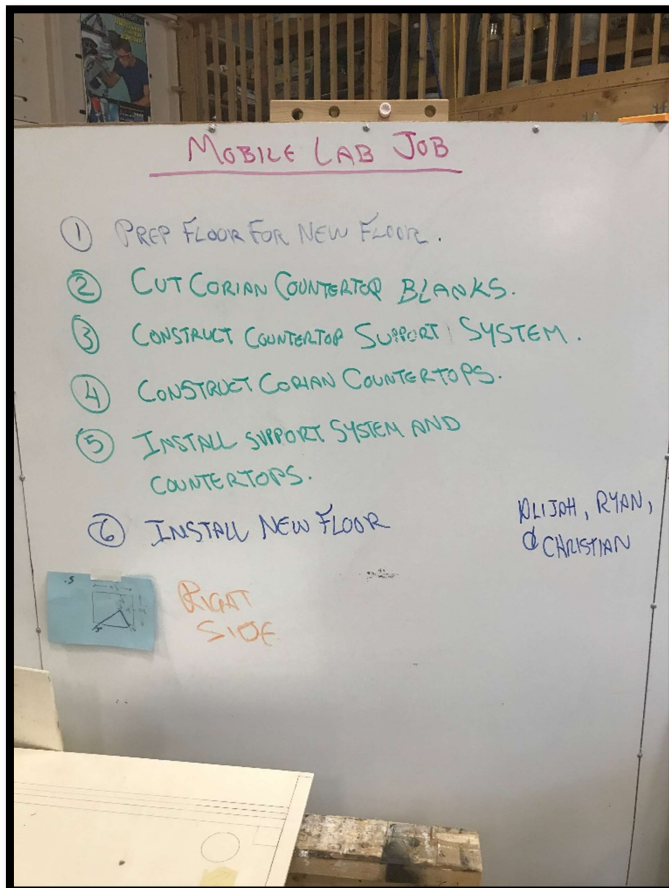


The bus begins its journey from BAT's maintenance facility in Brockton...



...to its new temporary home at the MakerSpace at Southeastern Regional Vocational Technical High School in Easton.

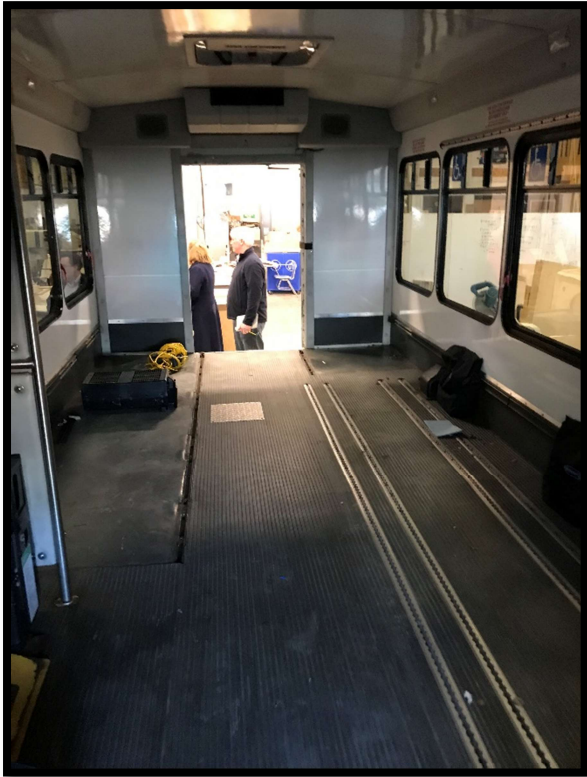
The talented instructors and students at Southeastern dive right into the project.

The mobile classroom begins to take shape!



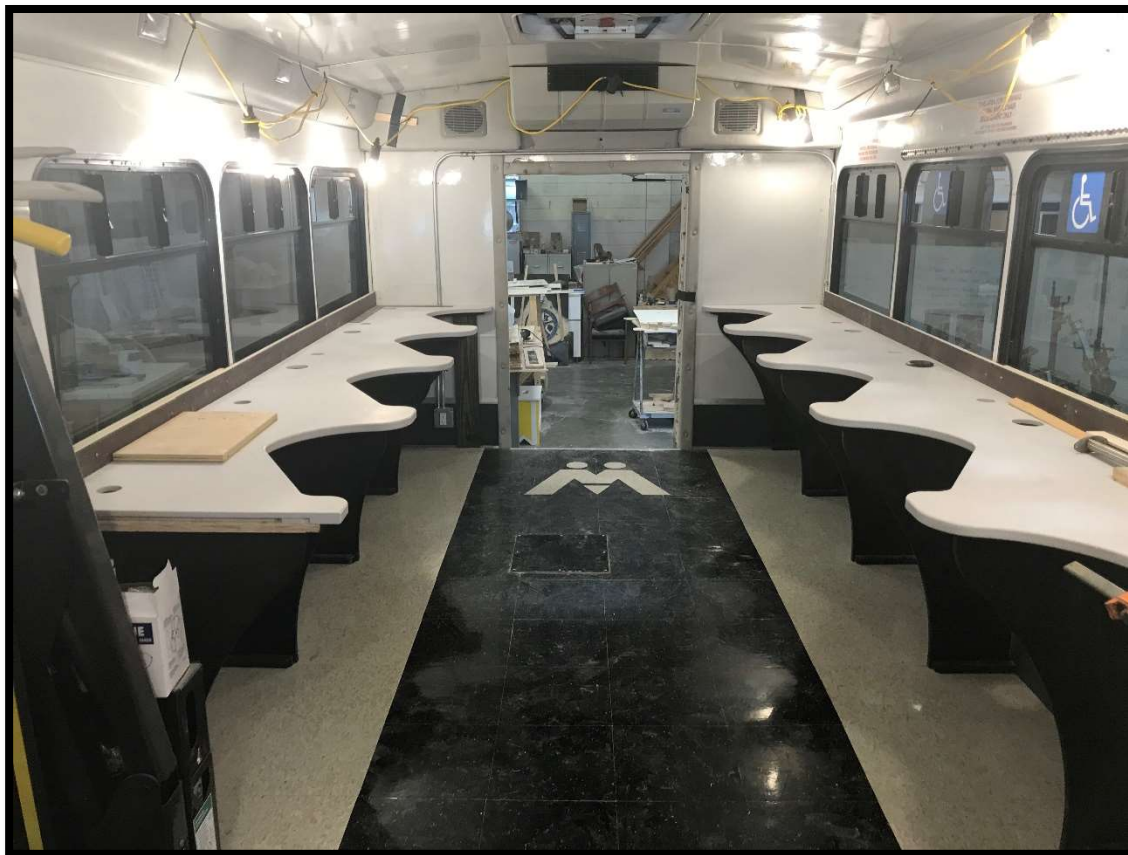
From front to back, the classroom has 4 workstations on one side and 5 workstations on the other side.
